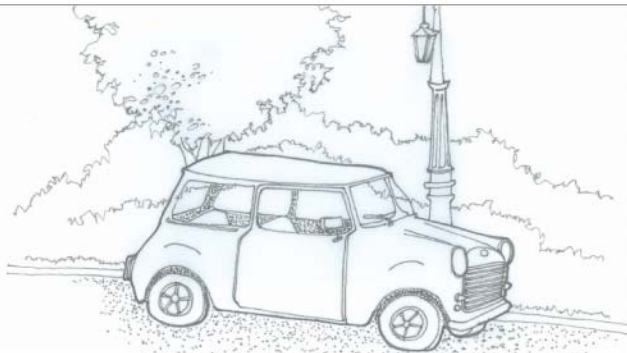

Midtown Tucson, which includes 12 square miles of the Sonoran Desert, is a land rich and varied in automobiles. Your chance of seeing automobiles depends on several factors. First, many automobiles hibernate during the night and are most active during the mornings and early evenings of weekdays and at all times during the weekends. With a few exceptions, automobiles are used to get to and from work from people's houses and so are unlikely to be seen during the day. Also, some automobiles have specific habitat preferences, such as dry garages and under shade structures. The suggested readings at the end of the checklist are good sources to find out just why they exist.

Many types of automobiles are known to occur in the Midtown area and several others are suspected. The automobiles in this checklist are categorized into the categories of *lifestyle* - using this checklist may even aid you in selecting your next automobile! Remember that all automobiles, including ones for First Time Drivers, are protected and should not be killed, collected, or otherwise molested.

The research area, the 3rd Street Bikeway from Campbell Avenue to Treat Avenue, is just a small, specialized sector of the Midtown Tucson District. The automobiles listed are not inclusive of the Midtown District and more research is required to fully understand the variety and types of automobiles habitating in the Midtown Tucson area.
